INSURANCE CONSIDERATIONS

The following article was contributed by fellow 302 member Terry Munroe. He thought Other hangar owners/renters might be interested in its contents:

Recently I have had discussions with other EAA members about the practice of renting or just letting a friend use hangar space for their airplane. The idea is great but it does have potential for issues in the future as they may relate to liability. As most of you know, I own a '76 Grumman Cheetah. I'm also a member of the American Yankee Association, (The International Grumman Pilots Association). The association publishes a very informative monthly newsletter called the American Star. As fate would have it, the most recent issue had an excellent article on the subject of liability insurance that was penned by Norris Hibbler, AYA Insurance Director and Owner of Aircraft and Marine Assurance, (part of the Fournier Group of agencies) in Vancouver, WA. Both the AYA and Norris's associates at the Fournier Group have graciously agreed to share it with us and here it is for your reference.

INSURANCE ARTICLE JANUARY 31, 2019

Have you been asked by the airport where your plane is tied out or hangared to show proof of insurance? A step further - have they asked to be named as additional insured on your policy? If not, do not be surprised if this request comes up in your hangar or tie down lease. In recent years, more and more airports are requiring to be named on tenants' policies. We often receive calls from clients expressing concern that this may increase their premium or complicate their insurance. Not at all. There is no cost to add airports as additional insured's to your policy. If someone gets hurt in your hangar or on other airport property caused by your aircraft, you know they will be looking to you for compensation from your policy. In addition, they will most likely look to the airport as well since they were on airport property. As you can well understand, the airport will want to pass any such claims that may arise on to your policy for settlement. What the airports are looking for is to be covered by the policies of the responsible parties if an aircraft causes injuries or damage on airport property rather than have to pay for any such losses from their own coffers. The airports not only want you to have a policy for damage or injuries caused by your aircraft on airport property, but also in your hangar (which is actually their property as well). Coverage for liability in your hangar is known as premises liability and is usually included in all aircraft policies for no extra premium. If an airport requires that they be named on a policy, they will require limits of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Just a note here - we never offer less than this limit on any of our policies unless the plane is down for storage. The difference in premium between \$1,000,000 and \$500,000 is nominal. It is just not worthwhile to go for less. Even if your plane is only insured for storage, the airport may wish to be added to your policy. You may wonder what could happen that a plane down for storage could cause any damage. However, we have unfortunately seen such claims. About four years ago, a plane in a hangar caused fire damage at a nearby airport. At least half a dozen aircraft hangared in adjacent hangars were totaled. Know that once added, your airport will receive a certificate showing that they have again been added each year at time of renewal. If your aircraft is kept in a hangar belonging to a private party rather than the airport, you will undoubtedly be receiving this same request from your landlord. They also will want to be named on your policy for the same reasons the airport does. Once again, there is no cost to add the hangar owner as additional insured. Both the airport and hangar owner will be looking to your policy for any damage or injuries caused to other parties by your aircraft. If you are fortunate to own your own hangar, you will be needing insurance to cover the structure just as you would your own home. We have several excellent companies available to provide you with the coverage you will need for your hangar or hangar home. Cost of insurance is based on square footage and rates can vary slightly upon location. Policies for hangars as well as the policies for aircraft offer expanded coverage's for contents you own and If you keep more than \$5,000 worth of tools or other aircraft parts in your which are kept in the hangar. hangar, you will want to increase the coverage for the contents. Premiums for both hangar structures and contents are very reasonable and well worth checking out. Even if you do not wish to insure a hangar that you own, the airport may require it. An important part of a hangar policy is debris removal. This is what the airports are looking for when they want to make sure your hangar structure is insured on their property. Should the hangar be destroyed by fire or other cause, they are not looking at rebuilding but rather at getting the airport area cleared of debris.






If you haven't heard yet, Chapter 302 was selected for one of the Ray Aviation Scholarships. This will be for **students 16 to 19 years old.** They can get \$10,000 for a Private Pilot rating, \$7,500 for Sport Pilot, or \$5000 for Glider. The objective is to reverse our miserable 20% completion rate into a 80% success rate or better. The scholarship will be administered by Chapter 302 and overseen by National Headquarters. If all goes well, there could be another million next year. Bring your possible candidates to anyone on the Board. The student will have to be associated with the local EAA chapter, put in some volunteer hours, and finish the rating within **one year.**

Visual Flight Note: Following Hwy 7 between Crockett and Centerville, at intersections of the Trinity River and Hwy 7, airfield is 6.5 nm west. Look for white oil storage tanks on North side of Hwy7. (See 499' tower same location on sectional chart.) Turn south one-half nm. Use left hand traffic for both runways. Runway width is 70 feet Trees to trees 100 x 3100' no overrun. Taxi only in mowed identified areas. 121.9 ground frequency may be given after landing and off active.


AFTER MEETING FLYOUT Farmhouse Restaurant Mexia, Texas
