### **NOVEMBER 9TH, 2019 MEETING MINUTES**

**Call to Order:** President Joe Waltz called the meeting to order at 10 AM. The first order of business was to recognize all of our veterans. Veterans Day is Monday November 11. Thank you all!

His grand-daughter Kiah is with him today and is interested in a Young Eagle flight! <u>New Member</u>: Joe Waltz says a guy he talked to has joined our Chapter. <u>Bret Hinkle</u> who couldn't attend today flies a Piper Arrow and Joe says he has joined mostly for the EAA Chapter 302 NewsLetter! Bret didn't Joe tell you it's free? <u>Buddy Jones</u> joins us and has been flying for some years. <u>David Peck</u>, currently flying at United Airlines, says he'll retire soon and he is getting current in general aviation again. Another United Airlines pilot <u>Eric Pelletier</u> has join our Chapter. He has also been flying the Conroe Flying Club. Welcome all.

**Treasurer's Report:** Beginning October balance \$4,426.84 and \$200 cash. Income / expense for October \$349.00 / \$251.49 respectively. End of month balance \$4,524.35 and \$200 cash.

**EAA's Homebuilt Aircraft Council Update / News:** Joe Waltz recently attended his first meeting as a member of *Homebuilt Aircraft Council* in Oshkosh, WI. This EAA volunteer council ensures a continued focus on vital programs that benefit homebuilders. Joe reports EAA is in good hands and that several exciting initiatives are on their agenda. They are working on several strategies that could be fruitful. One is to improve accident rate goals. A major FAA program called Modernization of Special Airworthiness Certification (MOSAIC) has been on the table for some time. MOSAIC could include some greatly anticipated reforms to the light-sport aircraft category, amateur-built aircraft, and the legacy fleet of general aviation. Possible weight limit increases on LSA, modernization of regulations for LSA / E-AB and finding ways to improve Build/Repair/Maintain knowledge are just a few components of reform ideas. MOSAIC could included changes in the repairman certificate rules also. Also, Council is looking for ways of strengthening the EAA Flight Advisor and Tech Councilor programs. Lots of information here. Check with Joe.

**Projects:** <u>Joe Waltz</u> / RV-10 = Avionics test is A-OK, leather console fabricated, air-conditioning installed behind baggage bulkhead. Hopes to fly before end of the year.

**Hints for Homebuilders:** Brian Carpenter of Rainbow Aviation talks about ACF-50 and Corrosion-X and how it can be used. It's an anti corrosive, a dielectric that creeps and propagates easily. Great for anti corrosion and lubrication around aluminum airplanes. Piano hinges are great places to use it. Corrosion at electrical connectors is inhibited. *It should not be used where you expect to paint!* 

**News / Reports:** Denny Irvine, Chapter Tool Crib Manager, asked for membership decision on adding a foot shear. EAA National has a program that will match 30% of qualified tool purchases up to \$300 per chapter for 2019/2020 until the \$30,000 grant is exhausted. Membership voted to spend as much as \$1,000 chapter money to add a shear to our tool crib. Denny will continue to shop.

### **TOOL CRIB UPDATE**



At the last regular meeting, Denny reported on the pursuit of a shear that could handle full sheets of aluminum. That created some feedback that we might have better luck with a tool that was built in the USA rather than China. The intent was to take advantage of a \$300 assistance from EAA National. We also had commitments from 10 members at \$100 each. However, the best price we have found so far is north of \$3000, plus shipping. That would mean the 302 Treasurer would still have to shell out over \$2000—too much for a limited use tool. We have not given up, and with 302 member Tom Kreiner's help, we will find a compatible deal.

Yep! A Pietenpol Sky Scout built by 302's own Don Brewer. Its a "years in the making" single place wood and fabric monoplane, powered by a Ford Model B water cooled engine (formerly owned by Allen Johnson).

It has a custom made scimitar prop, dual ignition and a gorgeous custom brass radiator. The wings are here too, just waiting to be mounted. Then it will be inspected by a DAR and issued an Airworthiness Certificate. The aircraft presently lives on "the Hill" in Building 44, B-1. Be sure to drop by and see it.
