This Week in Aviation History: To avoid fratricidal incidents, the D-Day planners called for paint and brushes, and ordered that the aircraft of the Allied Expeditionary Air Force and supporting units be painted with alternating black and white stripes on wings and fuselage - 18 inches wide on single-engine aircraft, and 24 inches wide for twin-engined craft. They were called invasion stripes. Tests showed that the stripes were easily visible on the ground and in the air - easier to see than the usual national markings that Allied aircraft bore, so a simple order - if it ain't got stripes, shoot it down - could be given out to Allied gunners and pilots. For fear of the Luftwaffe getting wind of the scheme and confusing the issue by painting their own stripes, the plan was a closely guarded secret. Crews had little time to complete the paint scheme. 

HOUSTON HONOR FLIGHT By Ron Cooke



A group called Honor Flight Houston sent 22 of us veterans ranging from WW-II to Vietnam to Washington, DC for two days to visit memorials. It was unforgettable. First Southwest airlines took group & individual photos of us, and a volunteer fixed us omelets Our plane was saluted by water canons from the firetrucks on arrival in Washington, and we were met by a school class of children singing patriotic songs, and a crowd cheering and shaking our hands. We first went to the new Air & Space museum for a visit, then we toured Washington in our bus finally stopping at the Marine Corp Barracks for dinner.

Afterward, the Marine Corps put on a show with their marching band and two companies and a Drill team. It was super. We went to a hotel in Virginia, and started with a great breakfast at 0600 the next morning. We started the day at Arlington Cemetery with front row seats for the Changing of the guard at the tomb of the unknown soldiers, and visited Neal Armstrong's grave.

We had a motorcycle police escort, and they drove us through traffic, through red lights and down the opposing lanes right through dense traffic. It was thrilling! We visited The Marine Corps Memorial, World War-II Memorial, Korean War Memorial, Memorial to Military women, Vietnam Memorial and finally the Navy Memorial before returning to the Reagan National Airport.

Finally, we arrived in Houston to another water cannon salute and were greeted by a crowd of about 300 people including Miss Houston, Marines in uniform, the Chief of Police, the Chief of the National guard who presented us with a certificate of appreciation and a band which played military music. I felt like a politician I shook so many hands.

They say "Those who don't remember history are doomed to repeat it." We at 302 did have a past history event of a disabled aircraft on the runway with a flat tire. When the FBO was called out to rescue the aircraft (and reopen the runway), they were awarded a bill for over \$300. OUCH!!

To address this, your tool crib manager built a "Rescue Dolly" consisting of a heavy steel frame, 4 castering wheels, and inserts for 5.00 X 5, 6.00 X 6, and Stearman wheels, along with ratchet straps to secure the gear. They sit in the tool crib (Jim Smith's Hangar) just beside the chairs & tables. They've sat there unused for over a year.

Then Friday, the 26th, the call comes in. Jim Archer exited Runway 19 and has a flat. Dolly to the rescue, and his airplane goes in the hangar. But at suppertime, another call comes in—Goebel's stopped with a flat on Taxiway Kilo. This takes a little more effort. Another trip to CXO, get a jack and get the Dolly off Archer's plane and put it under Mike's. Then he TAXIS to his hangar. (Without any right brake).

Moral: Don't repeat history. Remember the Dolly.




Nearing completion at Don's House
