The WINGS Pilot Proficiency Program is one way for general aviation pilots to ensure they are competent, confident and safe in their flight operations. Project Updates: Jose Ruiz / RV12 = Porter High School build. Building fuselage and tail cone, working wing build. Expect to fly next school year.

<u>Mo Postlewate</u> / RV-8 = Constructing wing and vertical stab fiberglass fillets or fairings. Wiring switches and fuses. Seats and mount prop soon.

Jim Morrical / Carbon Cub EX = Wiring electrical and panel with Garmin G3X, installing autopilot servos. Back in paint booth for metal parts. On wheels soon.

Shop Tips: Tom Kreiner demonstrates and discussed how to properly remove and install a tapered wheel bearing on a general aviation wheel. Use caution, do not bind the bearing in the race. To install use a correctly sized mandrel. Always following manufacturer instructions. Do not add preload to tapered bearings. Turn adjuster nut finger tight and back off about 1/8 of a turn to eliminate any damaging preloads. Thanks Tom.

Warbirds are back in the air in 2021

As I write this we are all celebrating Memorial day weekend and what better a time than an article about the planes used by the greatest generation to secure the freedoms earned by so many that never came home

The past couple of years have been a very difficult time for the warbird community. 2018 and 2019 was a period that brought a great deal of scrutiny from the FAA and NTSB. Unfortunately, much of it well deserved following a rash of accidents including the accident I was personally involved in that destroyed the C-47, Bluebonnet Belle. That event was followed shortly thereafter by the tragic accidents of the P-51, Pecos Bill in Fredericksburg, Tx and the B-17, 9-o-9 among many other lesser discussed accidents that year.

Most warbird operators including the Commemorative Airforce, Collings Foundation and Warbirds of America fund their operations by giving paid rides under an FAA waiver program call the "Living History Flight Experience". The result of those accidents was an overhaul of the training requirements for both flight crew and maintenance personnel and new inspection standards for the aircraft. The Collings Foundation lost their ability to give rides under the LHFE Waiver entirely. At the same time all owner/operators saw their insurance premiums skyrocket. Some by as much as 300% in a one-year period of time!

Then came the Covid pandemic. 2020 saw the revenue streams all but completely dry up. No airshows, no tour events, no paid appearances, no ride days...nothing! Many operators gave up. Aircraft were sold off by various museums hoping to generate enough cash to prevent having to close their doors for good. Houston's own Lonestar Flight Museum based at Ellington Field was forced to sell their B-17, Thunderbird as well as the P-47, Tarheal Hal. Prior to 2018 there were 12 operational B-17's traveling the globe. In 2021 there are just four B-17s operating in the world.

Now for the good news... 2021 has already shown that the public is ready to resume a normal life. The first airshow of the 2021 season was held in April at the Burnet Kate Craddock field in Burnet Texas. The show set records for the highest attendance the show has ever seen. Revenues generated by the venders and the Commemorative Airforce far exceeded their hopes and was a shot in arm for other show promoters hoping to see records at their shows that were soon to follow. So far, this season has lived up to that hope as presale tickets are reaching new records across the nation.

WARBIRDS CONTINUED

Conroe's own Gulf Coast Wing of the CAF is currently on tour in the southern states with the B-17 Texas Raiders, the SNJ-5 and the C-45. That tour is expected to last for approximately one month before returning home to CXO for scheduled maintenance and then hit the road (skies) again in July. So far, the reception to the tour stops has been overwhelmingly positive. Many of the rides on the scheduled stops are already sold out. Some stops are completely sold out and additional stops are being considered.

The Houston metro area is home to two CAF Wings and we are fortunate to have a cooperative agreement with the two wings that works to advance the aviation history programs designed to support the aircraft of both units. There is a variety of events planned and we invite you all to join us as we continue to remind the public of the sacrifices of the men and women that fought so valiantly during World War II!

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LONESTAR AEROBATICS COMPETITION

A total of 33 pilots flew at the Lonestar contest.

Two competed in Primary, first-time competitor John Hale in his 7KCAB Citabria won the category when Sportsman competitor Jeff Cain flew for a patch to provide him with another competitor in Primary.

With the most competitors of the contest at 12 pilots, the Sportsman category was owned by Michael Hoy who won all three flights in his Monosport 360. This was Mike's first contest of 2021. He last competed in 2020 at the Hill Country Hammerfest.

Bo Kalabus did a good job of staying right up next to Mark in his 1986 Christen Eagle II. His eagle is a family legacy from when his father started building it in 1977. Bo last flew competition at the Early Bird contest in Edna Texas, where he placed first.

With only a three percentage point spread in the final score the top contenders in the Intermediate category, the top four finishers battled their way through the the entire contest. Eventual first place finisher Craig Fitzgerald came out strong in the Knowns, barely held his lead in the Free Style, and came in second in the Unknown behind second place overall finisher Erick McDaniel.

Third and fourth place finishers, Doug Jenkins and Tom Rhodes were nipping at Craig and Erick's heels the entire contest. Especially during the Free style were the point spread was very tight ranging from a point spread from 1755 to 1782.

Another narrow point spread was seen in the Advanced category. First place finisher Patrick Clark held first place throughout the Known and Free style, getting edged out by Klayton Kirkland and Chris Magon for the third place in the the Unknown. But his previous points held up in the end.

Contest Director Mike Gallaway, orginally hoping to fly Unlimited flew in the Advanced category nearly unseating Chris Magon for his third place finish with a score of 75.65% to 75.83%. An exciting category for the eight contenders in the Advanced category!

The Legacy category attracted previous Legacy pilots from the Early Bird contest; Curt Richmond and Tony Wood. Curt lost the first and second flights to Tony, but came back with a very high score on the Unknown flight to secure a first place win.

Both competitors flying their own Pitts S-2Bs were joined by Herman Dierks, first-time Legacy pilot flying his Sukhoi Su-26.


