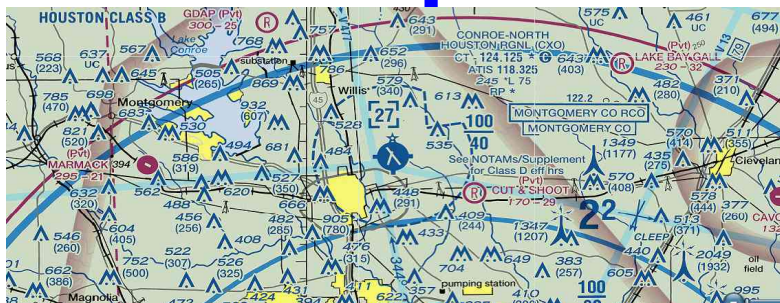

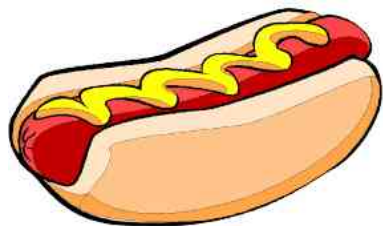

We easily beat the last world record set last year (2200+) by Richmond, California Rosies.

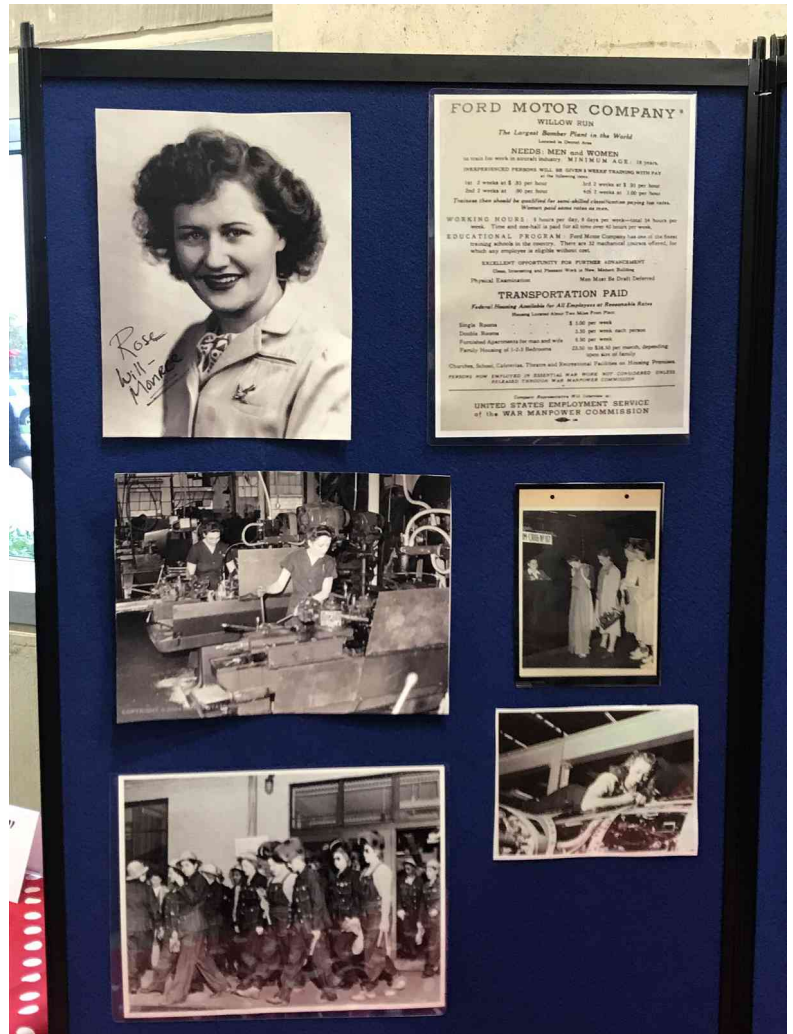
Our record - 3755. Three-thousand, seven-hundred, fifty-five. The attendees age range was 6 months to 110 years.
