Project Updates: Mark Haskell / Zenith 601HD = Fixing a builder error. Rick Oliver / Zenith STOL CH750 = Finished bottom and sides of fuselage and invested in more TOOLS! Drove 1691 miles to Aircraft Spruce, ATL to buy a \$260 piece of wood to save time / \$600 shipping. Does Aircraft Spruce know about this story? Jim Morrical / CarbonCub EX = Finished side windows, autopilot final install, Wt & Bal done. Engine run soon. Tim Grassman / RV14A = Wings hung, tail attached, engine installed.

Accident Briefing: John Blum is a Chapter 302 member and retired Captain with 35 years at United Airlines. John continues his passion now training young pilots as Director of Lone Star College's Professional Pilot Program. He built that program from the ground up. Recently while flying the school's Piper Seneca, N28HE, he and an applicant pilot experienced a catastrophic flight control failure. Preliminary reports say a bolt broke off the stabilator control link causing it to bang stop to stop. In short John never gave up 'flying' the airplane even as the fuselage was failing structurally. It pitched up 60 degrees at 3Gs or more, stalled and continued to oscillate uncontrollably and violently in pitch. Speeds varied 40 to 170 Knots. They landed hard under some control in a wet field. They had significant injuries, but thankfully the aircraft was right side up with no fire. The aircraft was destroyed. Aircraft in the area heard the emergency call and were helpful in getting rescue staff to the site. We're thankful for John and his willingness to share his personal experience. Even more we're grateful that he and his young commercial rated pilot are recovering. John is a great example of what is best about aviation.

One important concern component of our ongoing efforts to improve surface safety at CXO Airport involves conducting a Runway Safety Action Team (RSAT) meeting at least once each year. In conjunction with management, airport we will conducting a local RSAT meeting on July 12, 2023. The meeting is scheduled for 12:00pm and will be held at Galaxy FBO conference room.

The purpose of this RSAT meeting is to unite those individuals and organizations that are actively involved in air traffic operations and movement of aircraft, vehicles, and equipment on the Airport Operations Area (AOA). We look for participation from all major airport interests including tenants, fixed base operators, airport operations and maintenance personnel. Participants are asked to help develop recommendations and solutions to enhance surface safety. Those recommendations serve as the foundation for a site-specific Runway Safety Action Plan. 
