

SATURDAY'S MEETING/FLYOUT



This Saturday, Oct. 14, 2023, annular solar eclipse will cross North, Central, and South America. In the U.S., the annular solar eclipse begins in Oregon at 9:13 a.m. PDT and ends in Texas at 12:03 p.m. CDT. Therefore, the Regular Meeting will start as scheduled at 10:00 with a short briefing and a lottery for empty seats. We will launch individually and observe the eclipse from the runway at Mustang Beach. **Remember, do not look directly at the eclipse without proper eye protection.** When finished, we will fly to Gulf Coast Regional KLBX for lunch. Return time will be up to you.

If we have inclement weather, we will proceed with a regular meeting and watch the eclipse from KCXO if possible.



POST MEETINGFIBERGLASS SEMINAR



After the Saturday meeting, an informal talk was led by Rod Hicks from Rod's Fiberglass Repair on Highway 105 West. He talked about the new Gflex, which contains colloidal 403 filler in it—works better than 105 resin with plastics. Also discussed—temperature effects, time between layups, wash thinners, surface preparation, etc. It's a huge subject impossible to cover in an hour, so he left 302 a copy of the West Systems User Manual. It's in the tool crib—or--you can get your own by going to:


