Safety Minute: FAASTeam (FAA Safety Team) program manager Phil Dixon says when it comes to your airman medical status, just how honest and thorough are you when filling out that MedExpress or BasicMed form? Are you telling your AME everything he or she needs to know? If you are gaming the system, it's time to come clean. Search YouTube: *Don't Game the System with Your AME*.

Bird Strike: Tim Grassman had a bird strike recently on a Phase I test flight while on a 2 mile final to KCXO. The vertical stabilator was significantly damaged, but Tim landed his RV14A safely. There is real risk flying an unfamiliar unproven airplane with new complex cockpit, aircraft and systems. Adding an unexpected event like a bird strike can be overwhelming. "Distractions are real...stay focused and fly the plane." Tim received our EAA 302 first flight plaque.

Homegrown Waco Taperwing: Nick Coleman tells of a semi-forgotten airplane he found and completely restored and flew to EAA AirVenture 2021. Search YouTube: *Homegrown Waco Taperwing*

Project Updates: Rick Oliver / Zenith 750 STOL 4 = finished horizontal / vertical stabilizer, mount to fuselage next. Tom Hammer / Highlander SuperSTOL = 300 hours into project, sheet metal work, side window frames, installing Garmin Autopilot servos, wings with slats and spoilers mounted.

WHO ARE WE TALKIN' TO?

When you call up Conroe Tower/Ground, you'll hear one of 7 voices. Ever wonder who they are? The Tower is controlled by Robinson Aviation, a private contract group out of Oklahoma. Where else are Robinson Towers? Surprisingly all around us—Victoria, McAllen, College Station, Sugarland, Galveston & more. They're supported by Federal funds and each controller must maintain a 2nd class physical just like pilots



Shannon Henkel—the tower chief who replaced Ed Bruno. She was a military controller, having worked Approach Control at Laughlin AFB, Tower at Eielson AFB Fairbanks and Balad AB in Iraq. She's presently working hard to backfill two vacancies which is causing the others to put in a lot of overtime. Shannon has 21 years in Traffic Control.



Erv Funk—who like many of the rest, retired from the Civilian FAA control network. He spent 24 years Tower/Tracon in Reading and Harrisburg, PA and Dulles International, Washington. He's been with Robinson for 14 years. (That's 38 years total). Erv is also a rated pilot, holding a Commercial and Instrument rating in both Airplane Single and Multiengine Land.



BJ Mitchell—another one of the pilot-rated controllers. BJ had a generous friend who let him train for just fuel, so he has his Commercial, Instrument and Multi Engine. He's worked Baton Rouge, IAH tower/tracon and CXO. He retired from the FAA at 49 (mandatory retirement is 56) and has been here ever since for a total of 42 years controlling.



Ed McMahon—another Veteran! This time the USAF from 1974 to 1986 at Offut AFB, Myrtle Beach, Kunsan Korea, Scott, Bitburg Germany and Laughlin TX. Then with ATC he served Monroe, LA, Shreveport, and Houston Intercontinental. He joint Robinson in 2011 and first worked College Station before arriving at Conroe. This is his 49th continuous year of working Air Traffic.



Terry Klagmann—another one of the pilot rated controllers. To be exact—CFIIME. As an Army Private at Cairns AAF, Fort Rucker, he began flying as well in a Grumman TR-2. He's gone from El Paso, Midland, IAH Tower and Approach, Hobby, Lubbock and now here. He has just finished his 52nd year of controlling.



Mike McNamara—a Navy Veteran, serving from 1979 to 1986. He went to ATC through 2013, working Coast Tracon, San Diego Tracon, Hobby and Houston Intercontinental. Then came Robinson where he's worked in New Braunfels, Galveston and now Conroe. Mike has a total of 37 years in Air Traffic Control.



Chris Cabrera—the newest member in the tower. Chris came from the Marine Corps to round out having Veterans from all four services. He entered the USMC in San Diego in 2017, trained for ATC in Pensacola, and worked Tower in Yuma International. The Yuma gig was interrupted with a 7 month aircraft carrier tour. Upon separating from the Marines in 2022, he joined Robinson in Stillwater, Oklahoma and then arrived here.

ANOTHER COMPLETION AWARD AT CXO






From the *Cirport Director:* YTD operations at KCXO. Remember, this is as of November—final will be higher


