Treasurer's Report: Beginning balance March 1, 2024: \$10,585.02 + \$200 cash on hand. Ending balance March 31, 2024: \$11,092.64 - \$200 cash on hand. Highlights include: Dues income \$175, Swindle income \$150. Rent Expense \$25.

EAA Nat'l Gold Status: This year because of your chapter's strong commitment to general aviation EAA's Chapter Recognition Program has awarded us the **EAA Chapters Gold**. Meeting 9 of 11 program criteria qualified us for Gold. Details search EAA website: *Chapter Recognition*

Safety: Watched AOPA produced video. Mike Filucci prepares to land his French-built Socata TB 30 Epsilon only to discover gear unsafe conditions. This excellent example of a response to a partial gear failure culminated in a safe gear up landing. A common hydraulic line clamp failed and the loose line bound the gear up. Search YouTube: *The French Disconnection*

Program: Owner Warren Pietsch tells some of the storied history of his restored blue North American P-51C '*Thunderbird*'. Jimmy Stewart owned it. Joe DeBona flew it winning the 1949 Bendix Trophy Flight at the Cleveland Air Races. DeBona's record of 470.136 mph still stands today. Search YouTube: *Did You Get a Whiff of That Blue Mustang?*

Project Updates: <u>Tom Hammer</u> / Highlander SuperSTOL = Mostly finished main electrical wiring and avionics bay work. Comm radio & transponder are remote mounted with Garmin G3X panel. Engine planned is a 915 Rotex controlled by dual FADEC. <u>Bob Fay</u> / RV14A = Completed wiring, installed avionics, interior, cowling trimmed and fitted. Installed Vetterman Exhaust since Vans exhaust was \$\$ and delayed, engine is mounted. Hopes to fly this summer.

Maintenance Tip: Michael McDonald is a member of our chapter and a good resource with experience in welding. He discussed materials, corrosion and making decisions about serviceability. He said sometimes it is better to just replace parts and not try to weld up a questionable part.

Young Eagles Rally: Next chapter rally is scheduled for April 27th 9-11:30 AM. May 4th is the rain date. Need airplanes, pilots and ground crew.

Ray Scholarship News: Chapter 302 Board of Directors Scholarship Committee has made the decision to award EAA's \$11,000 Ray Scholarship to Jake Reynolds! He's very motivated and has been involved with our chapter for a couple years. He flew Young Eagles early on, has used Sporty's training module to grow his knowledge, passed the FAA Private Pilot Airman Knowledge Exam and completed his medical. Congratulations Jake!

- --Before each meeting some gather any time after 8 AM on the 3rd floor at Black Walnut Cafe for breakfast.


THE 302 BURGER BURN

ROSIE THE RIVETERS PRESENTATION

I was honored to represent my Mom, Rose Will Monroe, the ORIGINAL Rosie, at the Gold Medal ceremony April 10. Although there were 6 million ladies who entered the workforce in WWII, Mom became the human face to the lady in the popular Rosie song. She was a riveter on B-24s at Willow Run when actor Walter Pidgeon visited to film some war bond promos (and autograph "Pidgeon Coop"), and he recruited her to appear in them as Rosie.

The presentation was made by Speaker of the House Mike Johnson in the Emancipation Hall of the US Capitol in Wash., DC with Mae Krier happily receiving the medal on behalf of all the Rosies.

"Mae Krier, age 98, was primarily responsible for acquiring the Congressional Gold Medal award honoring all Rosies of WWII. She felt this acknowledgement was long overdue, and succeeded in her quest.



Dear EAA Chapter 302 Board of Directors,



EAA Learn to Fly Week inspires future pilots on May 13-18

Five days of free webinars capped off with Flying Start events held across the U.S.

EAA AVIATION CENTER, OSHKOSH, Wisconsin — (April 4, 2024) — Aspiring pilots can kickstart their aviation journey as EAA Learn to Fly Week returns on May 13-18. The six-day event enters its second year with expanded webinar offerings, and new topics to explore. Learn to Fly Week is supported by Sporty's.

"Learning to fly can seem like a daunting task at first," said David Leiting, EAA Eagles Program Manager, "but EAA's Learn to Fly Week will help the dream remain larger than any hurdles." Learn to Fly Week begins with 15 webinars scheduled over the first five days, May 13-17. EAA staff members and industry experts will be hosting each webinar. New topics for 2024 include getting started with helicopters, aircraft options for flight training, and training with FAA-approved flight simulators.

All webinars are free to attend, but online pre-registration is required. The week concludes on Saturday, May 18, with EAA Flying Start programs held at numerous chapters throughout the country. At those locations, prospective pilots can connect with the local aviation community, discover flight training opportunities available in their area, and take a free introductory Eagle Flight as part of EAA's program for adults that connects them with aviation resources.
