May 10th, 2025 Meeting Minutes

United Airlines pilot <u>Nic Keith</u> came to our meeting. <u>Bill Myers</u> is a commercial pilot currently training at ATP for his CFI. <u>Ed Camarda</u> owns a Grumman Cheetah here at KCXO and wants to meet others with aviation interests. <u>Dave Mooney</u> is from Huntsville and hopes to build a Rans S-21. <u>Kayden Mapes</u> is a student at Willis HS and is interested in learning to fly. <u>Kayla Nel</u> is working on her CFII. <u>Peter Geraci</u> joined the chapter today! He's restoring a Thorp T-18. <u>Trey Phillippi</u> participated in the RV-12 build at Montgomery HS in 2017-18. He's a Rice University graduate currently enrolled at ATP.

Treasurer's Report: Beginning balance April 1, 2025: \$12,280.06 + \$200 cash on hand. Ending balance April 30, 2025: \$12,493.58 - \$200 cash on hand. Highlights include: Swindle income \$101, Dues income \$225. Burger Burn expense \$330, Rent expense \$200.

Safety Minute: We watched the FAASTeam discussed aerial and ground pilot deviations and how to prevent them. Search YouTube: *Let's Take a Minute for Safety*

Project Updates: <u>Tom Hammer</u> / Highlander SuperSTOL = Painting interior to protect from UV. Working fittings on header tank, fabricating aluminum fuel lines and flex fuel lines at folding wings. Mounted 140 HP Rotax 915 iS with EPorp controls. Patterning the firewall thru wiring and fittings to lay out stainless steel firewall. <u>Bill Donahoe</u> / RV-10 = Worked with fuselage on rotator for access. Battery boxes installed. Instrument panel mostly complete. On wheels! Engine mounted, baffles installed, electronic ignition wired. Working cowling fit. Wheel pants mounting - somewhat technical work to level and square for flight.

Risen Ultralight: Chapter member Matthias Bell is headed to Italy. He will have a factory build session on his new Risen aircraft. This brief explanation from their website; "The Risen aircraft is manufactured in Italy and is a factory-built ultralight, not a kit aircraft. While some builders may visit the factory in Italy, for a portion of the build process, the aircraft is not intended to be built in a home garage. The Risen is designed and produced by Porto Aviation Group in Italy." Rich Jankowski will travel with Matthias. Looks like a very interesting trip and we hope to have a report on the experience. NEW TOOL CRIB ADDITION



Aircraft builders, take note—especially those who are building a tricycle geared airplane. We have a new accessory which bolts direct to the firewall and you can place weights on its platform. This way you can put your kit on its gear and move it around without it falling on its tail while you wait for your engine.

DON'T FORGET YOUR TOOL CRIB



Here comes an RV-14 with its left main on the EAA 302 Recovery Dolly. We won't say whose it is, but that sure looks like Don Colchin walking behind it.

You've just touched down, blown a tire and closed the entire airport for takeoffs and landings. Stressful situation, but your next decision could be pretty costly.

Calling an FBO will set you back around 300 dollars. But if you remember that the Tool Crib has a recovery dolly you could save a bunch. Start by calling one of your officers.
