302 MEMBER WINS AIRVENTURE CUP







Look at the speed! 18MPH faster than #2

Member Bryan Weinzettle took his RV-7 up to WI to participate in the AirVenture Cup Race. The event took place from Friday through Sunday the week prior to Oshkosh. Friday and Saturday were filled with registration, technical inspections, racer briefings, presentations, social hours, and organized dinners. The actual race was held on Sunday morning prior to Oshkosh with most racers headed over there after lunch. The awards ceremony was Monday evening at Oshkosh.

This was the 27th consecutive year that the event has been held leading up to Oshkosh. The first race, which took place back in 1998, was a true crosscountry event from Kitty Hawk, NC to Oshkosh, WI. Fast forward to today and it has morphed into more of a round robin / closed circuit type event starting in Wausau, WI, flying through part of the Michigan UP and ending in Merrill, WI. The actual check points were as follows: KAUW (start), KEZS, KMNM, KESC, KISQ, KSAW, KLNL, KTKV, KRLL (finish), almost 400 miles.

This year they had 97 aircraft racing and there was a class for everyone. In attendance were everything from 2 place Cessnas to turbine Legends and even a Cirrus Vision Jet. It's a timed event and the aircraft are launched one after another. The planes perceived to be the fastest go first.

With the technical support and mentorship of member Rich Jankowski, Bryan was fortunate enough to win first place in the Formula RV Blue class, which consisted 5 other RV-4, RV-7, and RV-8s. Bryan and Rich are already working on ideas to improve the speed further for next year though an endless quest of weight loss, drag reduction, and performance upgrades



VMC Question of the Month: You're flying on a hot, summer day. The outside air temperature is 100 degrees, but fortunately the relative humidity is only about 30 percent. In these conditions, should carburetor icing be a concern?

VMC August 2025 - Smoky Departure

IMC Question of the Month: You're flying an aircraft with a carbureted engine and have just completed a rather long taxi for departure. The outside air temperature is about 70 degrees F, and the humidity is high. As part of your runup, you momentarily turn the carb heat on, and noticing a reasonable drop in RPM, you turn it back off again. Should you be comfortable that the carb heat check is satisfactory? What other hazard might still exist, and how would you check for it?




