This information covers Experimental Amateur Built owners only. Other Category & Class will form classes later. MOSAIC now allows an EAB owner to sign off the Condition Inspection for an aircraft they own but did not build. Requirements are:

- --take a 16 hour class
- --certificate never expires
- --no recurrent training required
- --citizenship not required
- --effective October 22, 2025

CLEVELAND LOOKING FOR YE PILOTS





Our chapter is planning a big YE Rally on Nov 1, 2025. Our YE Coordinator, Dustin Newell wants to fly 100 kids! Because of my mentoring at the Cleveland High School, and the fact that the teacher there (Brian Stafford) is also a member of Chapter 1698, we are pretty sure that we can get 100 kids to sign up. We expect to get 10 to 12 pilots/airplanes from 6R3, but if that is all we can get to fly, we will probably have to do the Rally over two days (Nov 1 & Nov 2). Ideally, I would like to have at least 15 airplanes, which would mean 7 flights each. We would fly four flights in the morning, take a lunch break (provided by the chapter), then fly three more in the afternoon. With 15 airplanes, that would give us 105 YE flights. Our flights are very short. We take off, fly around the west side of the town of Cleveland, then return and land. It takes about 10 to 15 minutes per flight.
