

Flight Info: See sectional chart, near Leona VOR 110.8, 032 degree-15nm Lat. N31 – 18.27 Lon. 95-47.71. (Dillard) **TE01**, Radio required. **Monitoring 122.9.** Contact controller prior to entering pattern. Land and taxi at your own risk.

Visual Flight Note: Following Hwy 7 between Crockett and Centerville , at intersections of the Trinity River and Hwy 7, airfield is 6.5 nm west. Look for white oil storage tanks on North side of Hwy7. (See 499' tower same location on sectional chart.) Turn South one-half nm. Use left hand traffic for both runways. Runway width 100 feet, trees to trees 70 x3100 no overrun. Taxi only in mowed identified areas only. 121.9 ground frequency may be given after landing and off active.
