



GENERAL AVIATION PILOT PROTECTION ACT

This is such an important issue, you have gotten it from EAA, AOPA, your fellow aviators, and now your newsletter. If this issue passes, it will revitalize our general aviation industry and make life easier for all of us. The two bills in Congress—HR3708 in the House and S2103 in the Senate call for deleting the 3rd Class Medical and allow flying with just a Driver's license. The restrictions are:

- Not for Compensation
- VFR only, at or below 14,000'
- No faster than 250 knots
- 6 seats or less with aircraft weight less than 6000 pounds
- In 5 years, the FAA will review and make further recommendations
