



Announcement: Irvine will lead the next two meetings in Colchin's absence but come anyway.


Meeting Adjournment: The meeting was reluctantly adjourned at 1145.

Despite the title, Saturday, July 19 was very pleasant! We had a low overcast to start, but it lifted during the day and was smooth to Woodville and back.




