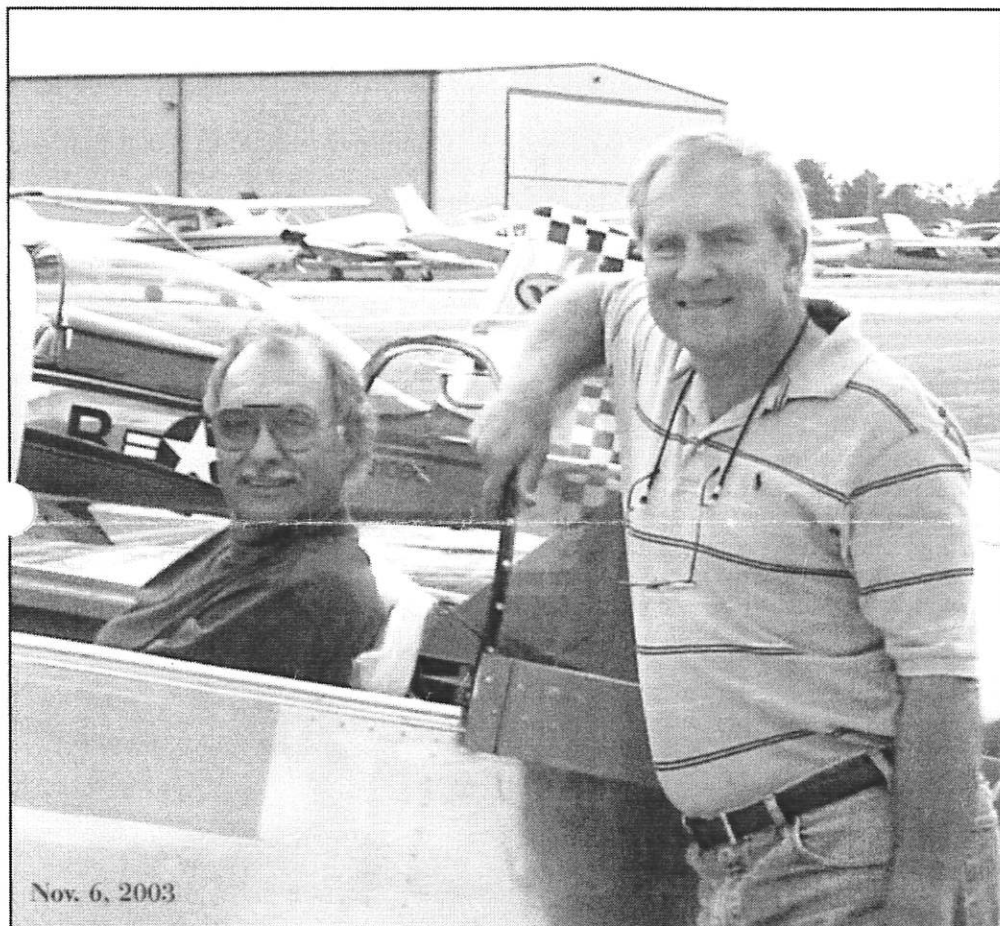

### ***Dynamic Duo complete RV-6 N16DD***

The Dynamic Duo of Dennis McCright and Dick Stevens have completed an RV-6 that even Bat Man would be proud to fly. This is a unique airplane made of many custom pieces, components and ideas borrowed from other RV models and the F-1 Rocket, a "glass cockpit", modified hotrod engine, and a 3 blade prop. It was inspected November 5th, with the 1st flight the same day. They flipped a coin to see who would fly it. The coin hit the pavement, rolled, then fell into a crack, coming to rest on edge! They tried again and Dick won the honor of making the first flight. All went well, so Dennis took it out for its second flight. Now, 50+ hours later, they have both been very happy with the results. ## EAA302 Minutes of 12/13/03

## McCright/Stevens RV-6, continued...

Perry McConnell opened the meeting at 9:05.

Treasurer's report: November fly-in was profitable. Rosanne sent us Fly-In and monthly reports. They are posted on the wall.

\*Perry distributed revised by-laws that he wrote to blend the EAA and Texas requirements. Doug Prior moved that they be accepted as presented. There was a second, a vote, it passed.

\*Dick Stevens accepted the position of Fly-In Chairman. (Thanks Dick!)

\*We still need a new Program Chairman.

\*Perry and Don Brewer distributed the 2003 EAA pins and Certificates to all those people that are helping chapter 302 as officers, committee leaders, councilors, and advisors.

\*We voted to contribute \$100.00 of chapter funds toward the purchase of a sign for naming the Lake Conroe bridge after the late Don Wylie, founder of Texas Air Aces.

\*Dick Kardell shared the story of a safe off field landing by Sam Ward in Butch Carr's new RV-8. After hauling it back to the Brenham airport, they installed a mag to replace one of the electronic ignitions. It ran fine on just the one mag, so Sam flew it back to CXO. But, he decided to turn on the electronic ignition once the CXO was in sight. The engine immediately lost power and continued to get worse even with the electronic ignition turned off. He managed another safe landing. This time on the runway with only one cylinder producing any power. The dual EI is being pulled while the engine is rebuilt and two new mags installed. (Glad Sam and RV-8 are OK!)

\*NOTAM: Pigs tore up the north end of Sandy Creek's grass strip.

\*Jeff Bilyeu, CXO Airport Manager, was our guest speaker. He gave us a look at the future of the airport. He also has funds to promote the airport... that is spelled "FLY-IN."

\*Guests: Jim Jackson and Dan Montgomery

+ Cowling is the Sam James "holy cowl" custom fitted and extended about 4" due to a 6" prop extension.

+ Extra inspection panels, and access ports, cooling fans above the panel that also act as windscreen defrosters.

+ Currently has electric elevator trim, aileron trim, flaps. Dennis is looking into an electric rudder trim.

+ Dick added a video camera to the tail. The signal is available in the cockpit and hooks up to a camcorder for recording in-flight videos.

+ EFIS is currently being replaced by a Grand Rapids unit so the airplane can be IFR certified.

So far the speed comparisons to the other airplanes we've been flying with, RV-8s and RV-4s, we have no problem keeping up with or out running most of them and the engine is still not broken in yet.

Dick says, "Its performance is better than expected. It's a nice fast cross country airplane." (Understated!)

Dennis sums it up... "So far the airplane is running beautifully, smooth and very powerful. It's a pleasure to fly. The horsepower is amazing. It's fun! It's so fast and so easy to fly, its been a real kick. I think it will be an airplane Dick and I can be proud of and that chapter 302 can be proud of."

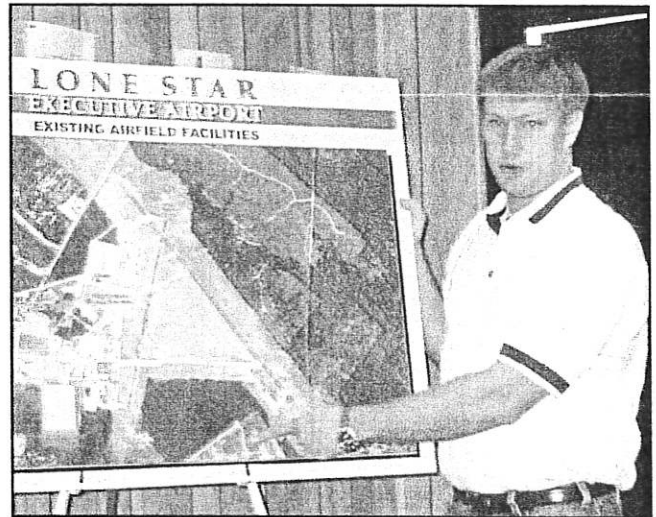
