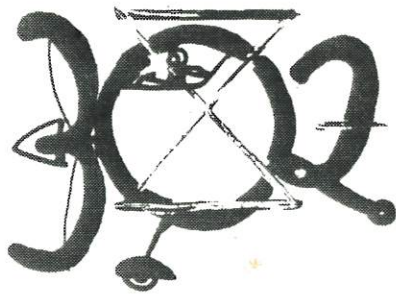

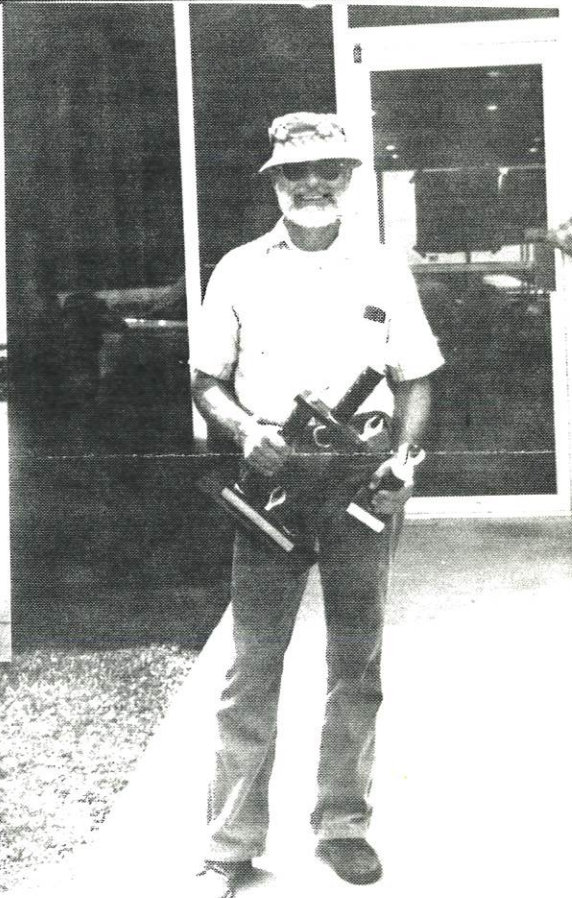
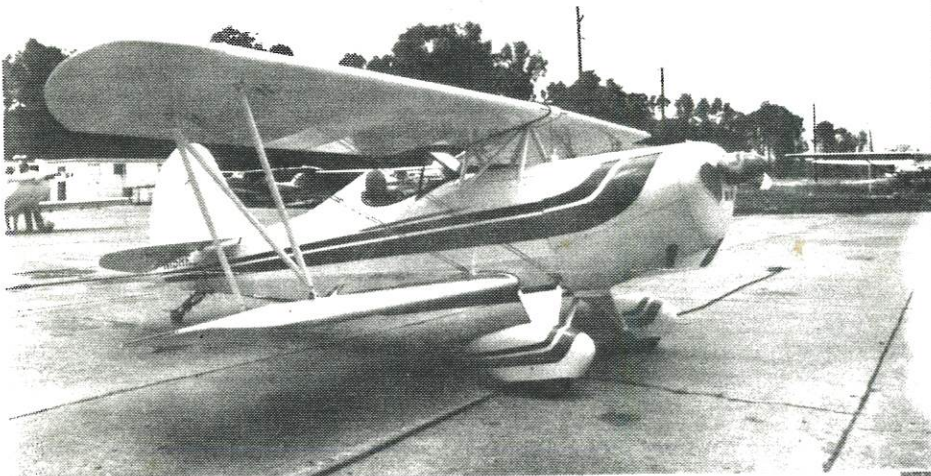

Notes from El Presidente:

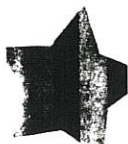
