
Chapter 302's Gingerbread Airport



Scale 1 square = 1 inch | Plane to scale, use $\frac{1}{2}$ tail for vertical stabilizer

Hanger Front + Back




Make 2. 1 with door

Hanger Roof




Hanger side






If you have nothing to do over the holidays, you can amuse yourself by making this gingerbread airport I made last year. Use any gingerbread recipe, but if you like the easy, foolproof way like me, take a commercial gingerbread mix and cut the water to $\frac{1}{3}$ cup. Enlarge this design on cardboard. This one took four boxes of mix. The runway is just an 11" x 4" rectangle. I anchored my buildings to a cotton-covered cookie sheet. Use any recipe for ornamental icing with egg white and confectioners sugar for construction. When buildings are up, let them sit at least 2 or 3 days in a cool room to make sure there is no "design flaw" that will make them collapse! Imagination is your only limitation in decorating. (Pieces take about 10 or 12 min. to bake. Trim uneven edges while still warm.)
